"We're hospitable," laughed Mrs. S. A. Gulesserian, 2102 University ave., wife of Madison's well-known rug dealer, "but our house isn't made of elastic, and it is not a hotel.

"Yes," she admitted, "we are expecting seven relatives to live with us, very soon, and seven more in a few months. They can board with us, but we didn't know where they could sleep, so we are going to build a big store-room or garage at the back of the house for them. We only have room enough for our own family."

The Gulesserians are from Iantab, Armenia and they are gradually sending for their relatives who are still there. Miss Mary Kevoldian, a sister of Mrs. Gulesserian, arrived in New York last week, but is quarantined on the vessel, a disease having broken out previous to landing. She expects to be out by next week. After going to Boston for a few days, she will come to Madison.

Six relatives of Mr. Gulesserian, four girls and two boys, leave Armenia in about two weeks and will come straight to this city. They are Mary, Louise, Afrania and Alisiak Gulesserian and Murad and Tusaint Gulesserian.

As soon as these relatives have earned some money, Mrs. Gulesserian explained, they will send for the other seven relatives. Those arriving next month are nephews and nieces of Mr. Gulesserian.
